Future Generations University

Future Generations University grew from a UNICEF Task Force to study sustainable and scalable community-driven change in 1992. After a decade of successful demonstrations across various development fields and country contexts, Future Generations established a graduate school. Future Generations University was authorized by the West Virginia Higher Ed Policy Commission in 2003 and accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Universities in 2010. Today, the University is the most applied accredited institution of higher learning in the world. It is dedicated to a more inclusive and sustainable future for all with graduates working in 55 countries across the globe.





The Master of Arts in Applied Community Development as well as various certification programs are interdisciplinary and span the fields of social change. All students must engage in community change initiatives to succeed in this applied pedagogy. They confront issues such as peace, climate resilience, and sustainable socioeconomic development to cultivate and nurture skills in leadership, management, and project design.

Future Generations approaches these complexities through its innovative pedagogy and curriculum. Blended learning integrates interactive online learning with field-based residential experiences and applied practice within each course's "community lab" component. Students are encouraged to remain in their home communities except for optional three-week residential courses. As a result of this innovative approach to learning, ninety percent of graduates remain actively involved in community work, equipped with enhanced determination and an expanded skill set.

Over the next three years, Future Generations University plans to inaugurate a PhD program in Applied Community Development. The Dean/Chief Academic Officer will play an integral role in the implementation of this degree program. The University currently offers a range of educational opportunities including:

Position Specifics and Requirements

The Academic Dean is the chief academic officer reporting directly to the President and is responsible for administrative management of the graduate programs. The Academic Dean has responsibility for academic leadership, hiring, supervision, and guidance of the faculty, oversees student recruitment and matriculation, program development, implementation, and assessment. Additionally, the Academic





Dean assists with university advancement when requested.

Educational requirements for the position include a doctoral degree in a subject area related to higher education programming or sustainable development. Experience and a proven track record in academic and administrative leadership is required. Knowledge of and/or experience in community development is strongly preferred.

Due to Future Generations University's presence worldwide, significant travel is required.
