This team from China was selected by Future Generations China, an NGO that promotes community-led development in partnership with government as a proven, alternative path to improving people's lives and places. The core of Future Generations work is a system that communities and governments can use to shape their futures. This system can create large nature preserves (as in Tibet, China), rapid social change (as in India), extend health services (as in Peru), or help countries rebound from conflict (as in Afghanistan). The global reach of Future Generations extends to more than 7,000 communities in 22 countries.

Future Generations China has been committed to environmental protection in China since our founder Dr. Daniel Taylor helped establish a protected area around Mt. Everest in 1989. Much of our work involving communities that border national nature preserves is endorsed by Chinese president, Hu Jintao. Our programs not only address conservation in Tibet, but now include environmental education through the youth programs and sustainable development projects in rural China through the Model Eco-Community Project. 
